This booklet explains how to apply for a place in a nursery school or a nursery class attached to a primary school in Tower Hamlets.

You will find this information useful if your child is due to start nursery or you would like your child to transfer from one nursery to another.

You need to apply by 14 February 2026 to secure a place for your child in the 2026/27 school year.



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Key dates at a glance

From September 2025

Read this booklet and consider which nursery you want to apply for.
You can visit nurseries to help you decide.

1 September 2025 to 14 February 2026

Complete the application online at www.eadmissions.org.uk
Apply for up to three nurseries in preference order. If you want to apply for a voluntary aided (church) school nursery, you must also obtain and return the school's supplementary information form with them.

14 February 2026

This is the closing date for applications.
Make sure you apply online by this date.

February to May 2026

The School Admissions Service will process your application to decide at which nursery your child can be offered a place.

7 May 2026

You will be sent a letter and email by the School Admissions Service informing you of the outcome of your application. If you are offered a place at a nursery, the nursery will write to you to confirm the arrangements for you to accept the place.

21 May 2026

Deadline for you to confirm acceptance of a place, directly with the nursery you have been offered. You can also add your child's name to any other nursery's waiting list.

September 2026

Your child starts nursery.

Children will usually start nursery school or a nursery class in the September following their third birthday. However, it is possible for eligible children to access a funded place from the beginning of the term after their third birthday.

How to apply

If your child was born between 1 September 2022 and 31 August 2023 and you would like a nursery place for September 2026, you must submit an online application by 14 February 2026. You should apply online at **www.eadmissions.org.uk**.

Please see page 29 for instructions on how to make an online application. It is a simple and easy way to submit your child's application.

You will then be able to:

- Search for nurseries in Tower Hamlets
- Access information about nurseries and links to their websites
- Make changes to your application up until the closing date 14 February 2026
- Receive notification of the outcome of your application by email.

When you have completed and submitted your application you will receive an instant email confirmation. You can make changes to your application up until the 14 February 2026 closing date.

If you wish to apply to a private nursery or a nursery in another local borough, you must contact the nursery directly.

You can apply for up to three Tower Hamlets nurseries. If you would like a nursery place at a voluntary aided school, free school or academy, you must – as well as completing an online application – complete the school's Supplementary Information Form (SIF) if they have one.

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) / Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)

Children with additional needs

If your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) then you must contact the Local Authority's Special Educational

Needs (SEN) team to access a nursery place. You can contact the SEN team on 020 7364 4880.

If your child has additional/special educational needs or a disability but does not have an EHCP, you should apply for a nursery place

through the usual route. You may also contact your local Children and Family Centre for advice on getting additional support. Information on Children and Family Centres in Tower Hamlets can be found on page 26.



This booklet is for parents with a child born between 1 September 2022 and 31 August 2023 who wish to apply for a place in a nursery school or a nursery class attached to a primary school in Tower Hamlets for September 2026.

Children will usually start nursery in the September following their third birthday. It is possible for eligible children to access a funded nursery place from the beginning of the term after their third birthday. Both part-time (15 hours per week) and full-time (30 hours per week) places are available at Tower Hamlets nurseries.

Who is nursery education for?

Nursery Education is free for all three to four-year-olds. Your child is entitled to 15 hours free early years education per week and this is available from the term after their third birthday.

The benefits of choosing nursery education

Attending a nursery school or a nursery class gives children a valuable introduction to school. They will have the opportunity to develop their skills and to be part of a large group of children of their own age. We work in partnership with parents to give your child the best possible start to their education and prepare them for reception class.

Our nurseries are run by experienced, early years trained teachers and supported by nursery nurses and early years trained teaching assistants.

Most nursery education in Tower Hamlets nursery schools and nursery classes has been rated 'Good' or 'Outstanding' by Ofsted.

The nursery day is arranged to allow each child to develop at their own pace. Nursery classes are usually organised in the same way as a school, with three terms.

A typical day in nursery consists of two sessions: a morning session from approximately 9am to 12pm and an afternoon session from approximately 12:30pm to 3:30pm. Some settings offer wrap-around-care which means children can attend breakfast club (e.g. from 8am) and after school care (e.g. until 5:30pm).

Nurseries welcome visits from parents as we want you to feel confident that you pick the right setting for your child. It is well worth visiting a few nursery settings before making your application.

Other pre-school provisions

Private, voluntary and independent nurseries, preschools and play groups also offer pre-school provision. A list of these providers is available from the Family Information Service on **020 7364 6495**.

Nursery class sessions

Nursery classes are part-time for 15 hours or full-time for 30 hours each week during school term.

Usually children attend either a morning or afternoon session of three hours, or a full day. Where a school offers both morning and afternoon sessions, the school will allocate the sessions. Sessions may be allocated in consultation with parents. No guarantee is made of the session time when a place is offered. Children from multiple births will be offered the same session.

Part-time and full-time funding

All 3 to 4-year-olds in England can get 570 free hours per year. It's usually taken as 15 hours a week for 38 weeks of the year, but you can choose to take fewer hours over more weeks. Your child becomes eligible for this the term after their third birthday, until the child reaches compulsory school age i.e. the term after their fifth birthday.

An additional free 15 hours may be available for families where both parents are working (or the sole parent is working).

Typically, each parent must earn the equivalent of 16 hours a week at the national minimum or living wage and less than £100,000 a year to be eligible.

Only part-time places will be offered as part of this coordinated scheme. Once your child has been offered a part-time place, you may request a full-time place from your nursery. Full-time places will be subject to availability and will depend on the eligibility criteria and HMRC eligibility code proof.

Parents not eligible for the additional free 15 hours may still access a full-time place by paying for additional hours. This fee will be set by each nursery. Please contact your local nursery for further information.

Early learning for two-year-olds

Some children may be eligible for 15 hours of funded childcare from the term after their second birthday. Unlike the nursery education for three and four-year-olds which is open to all, the early learning for two-year-olds is only available to children and families that meet certain criteria.

You can check whether your child is eligible by going to: www.childcarechoices.gov.uk

Alternatively, you can go to your nearest Children and Family Centre, and they will be able to do the check. For more information on Children and Family Centres please see page 26.

You can also call the Family Information Service on **020 7364 6495**. The Family Information Service will also be able to discuss with you what childcare is available and what best suits you and your child.

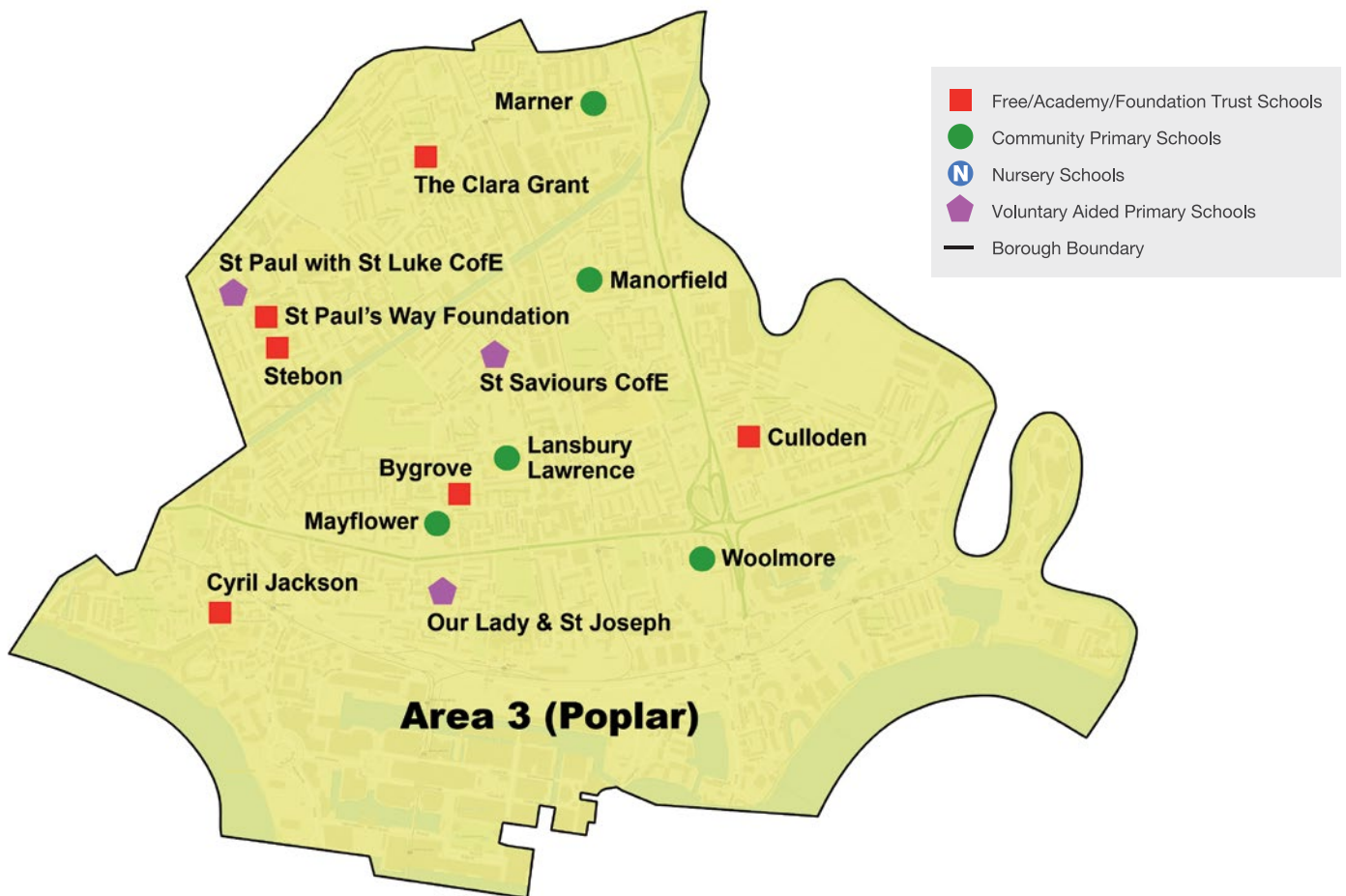

Closing date

The closing date for applications is **Friday 14 February 2026**. All applications made during the application period are treated in the same way in accordance with the procedure described in the following sections. Applications are not processed on a first come first served basis.

Applying after the closing date

Applications received after 14 February 2026 will be dealt with after all on-time applications have been considered. Many nurseries will not have any places available after considering on-time applications.

How decisions are made

The School Admissions Service Team will process applications and coordinate the decisions for all those who apply.

Your application for each school is processed individually and, in each case, a decision is taken to determine whether or not your child can be offered a place.

If we find that we can place your child at more than one of your school preferences only one school will be allocated. This will be for the highest preference school at which an offer can be made.

The decisions on applications for Tower Hamlets community nurseries are made by the Local Authority. If a Tower Hamlets community nursery receives more applications than places available,

the decision on whether or not a place can be offered will be made in accordance with the Local Authority's admission criteria set out in priority order as follows:

1. Children looked after by the Local Authority including adopted children who were previously looked after and children who leave care under a special guardianship or residence order. This also includes children who were previously in care abroad;
2. Children for whom it is deemed there is strong educational, medical or social reason to attend the school applied to (**see note 1**);
3. Children living within the catchment area who have a sibling attending the school (including the school of separate infant and junior schools) and who will continue to do so on the date of admission (**see note 2**);
4. Children whose parent is a member of staff who has been employed at the school concerned for two or more years at the time of application and/or children of a member of staff who has been recruited to fill a vacancy for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage;
5. Children who live within the catchment area of the school and for whom the school applied for is their nearest community school within the catchment area;
6. Other children from within the catchment area of the school;
7. Children living outside of the catchment area with a sibling at the school;
8. Children living outside of the catchment area of the school applied to.

Notes

Note 1: This can include the parents', carers' or other family members' medical conditions and the family's social needs. Parents must complete the relevant section on the application form and attach medical and/or social reports from a suitable professional (e.g. a doctor or social worker) to support the application.

Note 2: Sibling means a whole, half or step-brother or step-sister resident at the same address.

Tie-break

In the event of oversubscription within categories 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 above, priority will be given to children who live closest to the school by the shortest walking distance. A digitised Ordnance Survey map is used to measure the distance from the home address to the school's designated official entrance. In the event of two distances being the same, a decision will be made by random allocation.

Confirmation of address

Applications should be submitted according to where the child normally resides. This will normally be with an adult or adults who have legal responsibility for the child. Where the child lives at the property for part of the week with different adults who have legal responsibility, the address where the child spends the majority of the week will normally be used.

If time is spent between two homes equally, the parents/carers must agree the address to be used and a single application should then be made. This will commonly be where child benefit is payable, however all evidence will be taken into account.

Parents will be required to provide acceptable independent proof of their child's address. This may include council tax records. They must make sure that the application form they complete is accurate and must contact the Admissions Service and tell their child's headteacher if there is a relevant change after it has been submitted. Places may be withdrawn if false information is entered on the application form. Parents who do not provide evidence of their child's address as requested, or

provide conflicting or inconclusive information, may have the place withdrawn even if it has already been accepted.

Admission arrangements for voluntary aided schools, academies and free schools

For voluntary aided schools, free schools and academies, it is the school's governors who will make decisions, based on the information you provided in your application and the school's Supplementary Information Form (SIF). Admission policies and oversubscription criteria for these schools can be found on their websites or at www.towerhamlets.gov.uk/schooladmissions.

The Paradigm Academies (Culloden, Old Ford and Solebay), St Paul's Way Foundation Trust School, The LETTA Trust Primary Schools (Bygrove Primary School and Stebon Primary School) and The Clara Grant Primary School have delegated decisions on admissions to the Local Authority and, therefore, use the same oversubscription criteria as Tower Hamlets community schools.



Understanding school catchment areas and the oversubscription criteria

Understanding school catchment areas and the oversubscription criteria

Tower Hamlets Local Authority seeks to operate an admissions system that provides equal and fair opportunities to all applicants. This includes having due regard to children living in areas where there are limited options in applying for a local school place.

School catchment area

A school catchment area is a geographically defined boundary used to help provide children with fairer access to a local school and ensure all schools in an area have an equal share of children.

A child living in the school's catchment area will, therefore, be given priority over a child living outside of the school's catchment area. This does not affect admission categories where children with a statement of special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) or an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) are considered before any other admission. Catchment areas also do not affect Looked After children who are given priority in the admission policy. Other exceptional cases, such as medical and social reasons, will also be given priority before children living in the catchment area.

There are six school catchment areas for admission to Tower Hamlets community schools. The Paradigm Academies (Culloden, Old Ford and Solebay),

St Paul's Way Trust Primary School, Bygrove Primary School, Stebon Primary School and The Clara Grant Primary School also use these catchment areas in their admissions criteria. Each catchment area has several schools that you can choose from.

Nearest school within the catchment area

Higher priority is given to children who apply to the nearest school within their catchment area. This reduces the possibility of a family having to undertake an unreasonable journey to school and provides equal opportunity for families living in parts of the borough where there are a limited number of schools. Please see the examples on the next page which show how this works in practice.

Equal preference system

A model where all applications are treated equally in accordance with the admissions policy. Therefore, if a nursery receives more applications than it has places available, the admission criteria will be applied to each application with no consideration given to whether or not the nursery is the first, second, or third preference.

Distance criteria

When there are more children within one of the admission priorities than there are places remaining at the school, the Local Authority must decide who to offer places to. Priority will be given to children who live closest to the school by the shortest walking distance.

For example, a school may have 25 places remaining once all children for whom the school is the nearest school in the catchment area, but there are 30 other children who have applied and live within the same catchment area. The 25 children that live closest to the school will be offered a place and the five children that live furthest from the school will not be offered a place.



Understanding school catchment areas and the oversubscription criteria

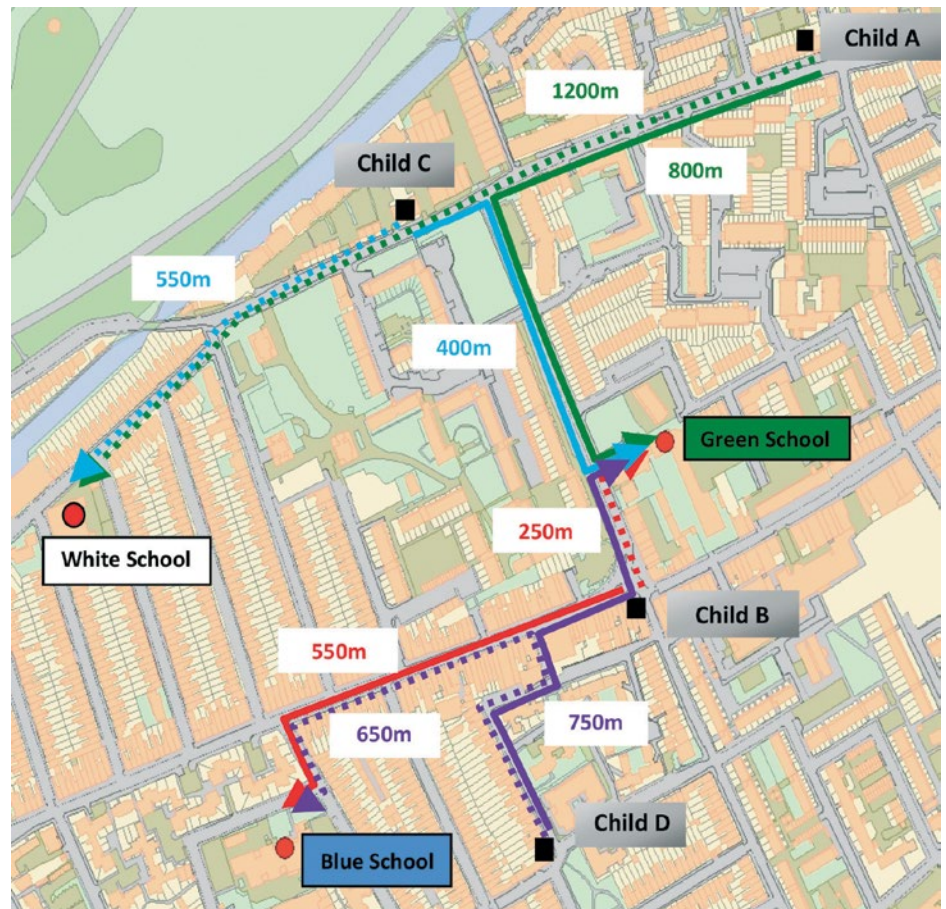
Example 1

In this example, Child A, Child B, Child C and Child D have all applied to Green School.

Green School is the nearest school for Child A, Child B and Child C. The nearest school for Child D is Blue School.

Given that Green School is Child A, Child B and Child C's nearest school, their applications will have higher priority than Child D's.

The highest priority would be given to Child B who lives 250m away from Green School, followed by Child C, who lives 400m away and then Child A, who lives 800m away. These children would, therefore, be ranked in order of priority as follows:



Admissions Criteria	Ranking Order
Priority 5 – nearest school in catchment area	1. Child B 2. Child C 3. Child A
Priority 6 – catchment area	4. Child D

Note: Although Child D lives closer to Green School than Child A, Child A will have higher priority because Green School is Child A's nearest school.

Example 2

This example is similar to the first one, but here Child B has decided not to apply to Green School, which is Child B's nearest school.

Even though Child B lives closer to Green School than the other children, Child B would not be considered for a place at Green School, because no application was made. The ranking in order of priority would therefore be as follows:

Admissions Criteria	Ranking Order
Priority 5 – nearest school in catchment area	1. Child C 2. Child A
Priority 6 – catchment area	3. Child D

Note: Child B's applications to Blue and White School would not be considered under the nearest school criterion because neither of these schools are Child B's nearest school.

Notification of decisions

If your application is received on or before the closing date (14 February 2026), the School Admissions Service will notify you of the outcome of your application by letter and email. The letter will be sent on **7 May 2026** and will name the nursery at which a place has been offered for your child. The email will be sent after 5pm on the same day. **This offer will be for a part-time place only.**

If you have not been offered a place at your chosen nurseries, you will be sent a list of nurseries that still have places remaining and given the opportunity to visit and apply to one of these nurseries. Your child will also be placed on the waiting list for your preferred nursery.

You must accept or decline the offer of a place by 21 May 2026 so that nursery places can then be re-allocated. If you do not reply by 21 May 2026, the offer may be withdrawn.

Appeals

As nursery is non-statutory, parents do not have the right of appeal if they do not get their preferred nursery choice. However, parents may contact the Local Authority for more information on the reason as to why their child was not offered a place.

Waiting lists

All children will automatically be added to the waiting lists of higher preference nurseries than the one offered, unless parents ask to remove their child from a waiting list.

Waiting lists for Tower Hamlets community nurseries will be kept and maintained by the School Admissions Service in the order of priorities set out on page 16.

Waiting lists for Own Admission Authority nurseries i.e. voluntary aided schools, academies and free schools will be kept and maintained by the nursery itself.

Post offer process

After 7 May 2026, unsuccessful applicants will automatically be added to the waiting list for their preferred nursery. At this stage consideration will be given to late applicants (i.e. those that applied after 14 February 2026) alongside those that were unsuccessful in the initial round of offers.

From 7 June 2026, the School Admissions Service will identify nursery places for any children that are unplaced and those that applied late.

From September 2026, parents wishing to make an in-year transfer application, or parents who wish to make an application who have not yet done so, must make an In-Year Nursery application.

If your child turns three during the 2026/27 school year, you may apply for a nursery place for the term following their third birthday.

Frequently asked questions about nursery admission

Q When can my child start nursery?

Children can start nursery from the term following their third birthday. If your child was born between 1 September 2022 and 31 August 2023 and you would like a nursery place for September 2026, you must submit an online application by 14 February 2026.

For guidance on how to make an application, please see page 29.

Q What if I want a nursery place before September 2026?

If you would like a nursery place for your child for the term following their third birthday but before September 2026 i.e. in January or April 2026, please refer to page 28 for advice on how to make an in-year nursery application, or contact the School Admissions Service.

Q What if my child turns three during the 2025/26 school year?

If your child turns three during the 2025/26 school year, you may apply for a nursery place for the term following their third birthday by making an in-year application. For information on how to do that, please refer to page 28. Alternatively, you can contact the School Admissions Service.

Q What if I am not a Tower Hamlets resident but would like a place at a Tower Hamlets nursery?

If you are not a resident of Tower Hamlets but wish to apply for a Tower Hamlets nursery, you can also submit an online application via the Eadmissions website: www.eadmissions.org.uk.

For information on private or voluntary nurseries or playgroups, you can contact them directly or you can contact the Family Information Service on **020 7364 6495**.

Q Will my child be offered a full-time place?

The Local Authority will only offer part-time places i.e. for 15 hours per week. Once your child has been offered a part-time place, you may request a full-time place from your nursery.

Q Can my child attend more than one provision?

It is not recommended for a child to be attending more than one type of under-fives activity (e.g. playgroup in the morning and nursery class in the afternoon). The adjustment is too demanding and confusing for most children of this age and much of the benefit from either activity could be lost.

Q Can I transfer my child between nurseries?

Once children are admitted to nursery education, it is in their interests to remain at that school until they have to move on and start reception class. Children take at least a term to settle and can find it very upsetting to move at this stage.

Transfers will only take place at the start of each term and should only be considered if a family has moved from the area or on exceptional grounds. Please refer to page 28 for more information.

Q If my child is already in the school's nursery class, is there an automatic right to a place in the reception class?

No. When parents apply for their children to start reception, no priority is given to children that attend the nursery of the school. The decision on whether or not a place can be offered will be made in accordance with the school's admission policy. The policy used for community schools in Tower Hamlets is explained on page 16.

You must submit an online application by 14 February 2026

Before you apply:

DO:

- ✓ **Visit nurseries** – this is the best way to get a feel for the nursery. You can meet staff, ask questions and see the nursery in action.
- ✓ **Read this booklet** – It is important you understand the policy and process.
- ✓ **Think about what is right for your child** – don't rely on what others tell you, do your own research.
- ✓ **Think about the journey** – how easy will it be to get to the nursery?
- ✓ **Check the admissions criteria** and how likely it is that your child would be offered a place.
- ✓ **Use all your preferences** – List nearest nurseries for convenience

- ✓ **Ask the School Admissions Service Team for advice.**
- ✓ **Make sure you press 'submit' when you finish your online application.** You should receive a reference number confirming safe receipt.

DON'T:

- ✗ **Put private (independent) fee paying nurseries on your application** – you should apply directly to the private nursery.
- ✗ **Wait until the last minute to apply** – you may have problems logging in or getting online. Give yourself plenty of time to think things through.
- ✗ **List only one nursery** – your application won't be treated more favourably and you could lose out on another nursery you like.

Tower Hamlets Early Help & Children and Families Service provides support to children, young people and their families at the earliest point when challenges first arise and to stop these from escalating.

Early Help is primarily delivered through our 12 Children and Family Centres, a place where parents, carers or families with children from birth – 19 years of age (or up to 25 with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) can go to and use play facilities, join groups and receive support.

Children and Family Centres aim to improve outcomes for all children, young people and their families by shaping:

- child development and school readiness
- parenting aspirations and parenting skills
- child and family health and life chances.

Children and Family Centres work with parents, families, settings and the community from as early as possible to make sure children are ready for school. The centres offer a range of support to parents including dedicated school readiness workshops which include toilet training and managing behaviour.

There are 12 Children's Centres across the borough each offering both universal and targeted services for families:

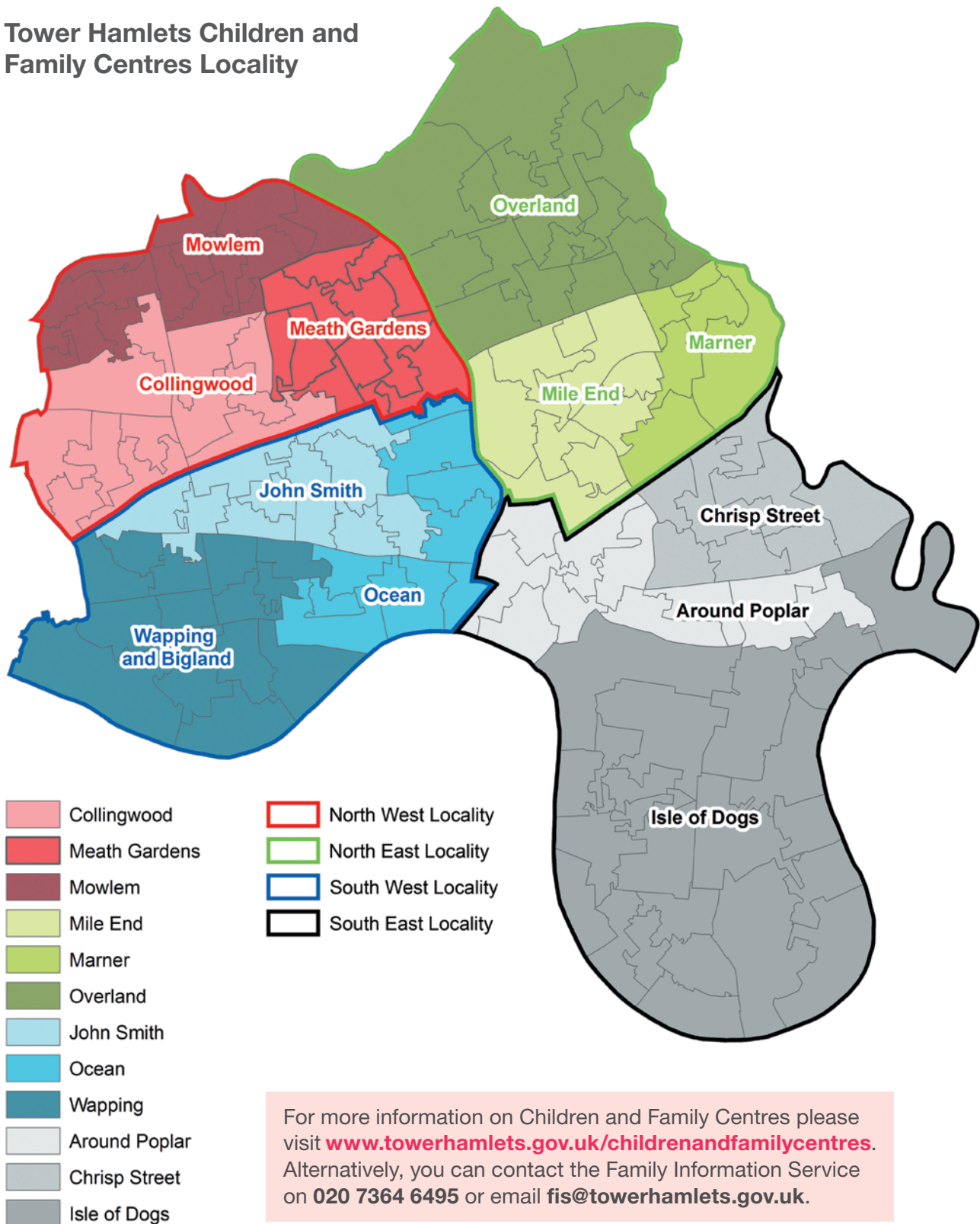

Transferring from one nursery to another (in-year nursery transfer)

If you want to transfer your child from one nursery to another please visit the Tower Hamlets website for more information on Nursery In-Year admissions.

Once children are in nursery, transfers to other nurseries (in-year transfers) will only take place at the start of each term (i.e. January and April), unless there are exceptional circumstances for a transfer to be considered earlier.

It is not always possible for a child to transfer to another school if that school is already full or if there are more applicants than places available at the time you make your application. Your child will, therefore, be placed on the school's waiting list in line with the school's admission criteria.

The Local Authority will consider transfer requests in line with the timetable below.

If your child turns three during the 2025/26 school year, you may apply for a nursery place for the term following their third birthday i.e. January 2026 or April 2026.

Admission to primary school

Whether or not your child is accepted for a nursery class place, you will need to apply separately for a place in the reception class of a primary school.

There is no automatic right of transfer from the nursery class to the reception class in the same school, and attending a nursery class does not give any priority for admission to reception class at the same school.

You can apply for a reception place at a different primary school to one where your child attends the nursery.

Children eligible for nursery in 2026/27 would normally start primary school in September 2027.

The application period for admission to reception class in 2027 will be from 1 September 2026 to 15 January 2027. A booklet with information about applying for a reception place will be available online at www.towerhamlets.gov.uk/schooladmissions from 1 September 2026.

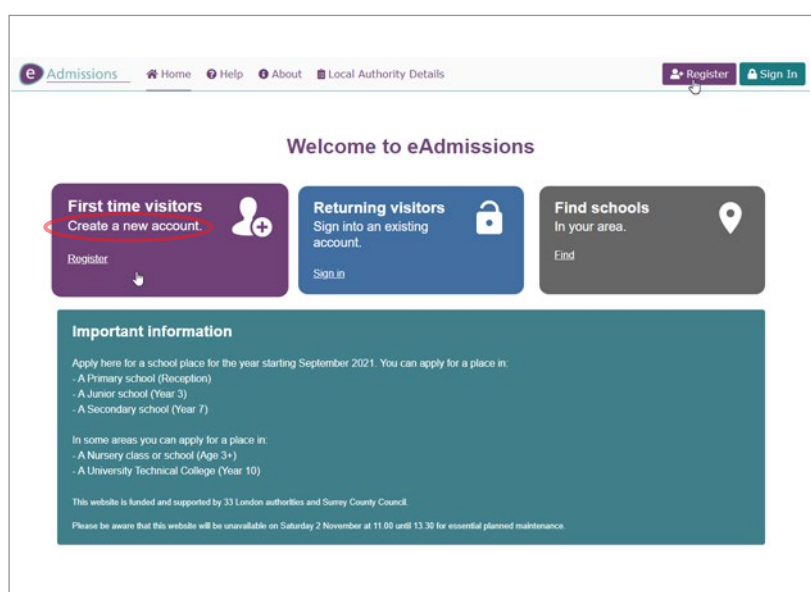

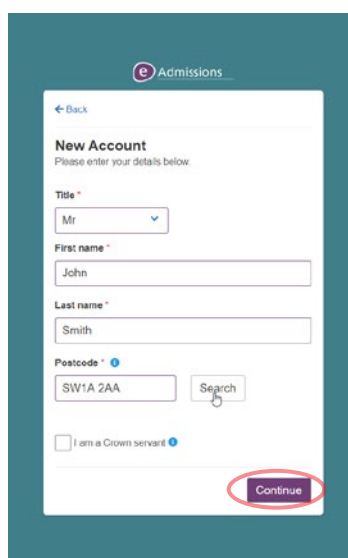

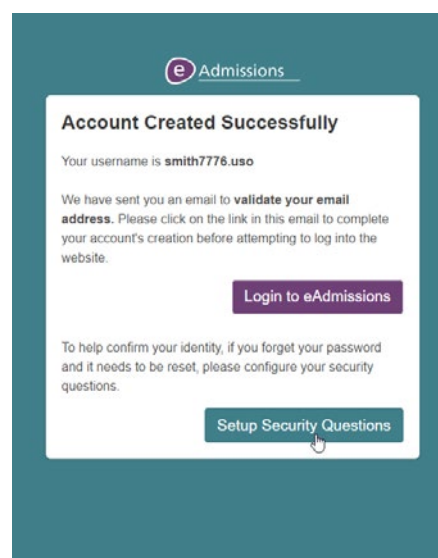

A step-by-step guide to applying online

Start an application

You can now log in with your email or username and will be directed to the home page – see figure 4.

From here you can make a new application, edit an existing application, view the details of any application already submitted and view the outcome of your application once it is available.

Click on 'Start Application' to begin.

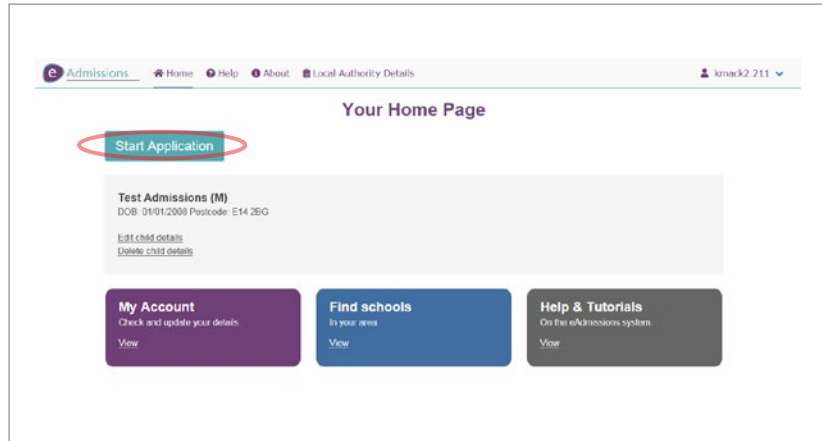

Stage 1 – Child details

Fill in your child's details and then click 'Save and continue' – see figure 5.

Stage 2 – School preferences

Here you can apply for up to six schools, in Tower Hamlets and/or other boroughs. You should select the schools in order of preference, with the first selected school being your first preference and so on.

You can add a school in one of three ways:

1. By selecting the borough of the school using the dropdown list and then selecting the school.
2. By selecting your school from its location on a map.
3. By searching for the school by using keywords.

Click on 'Continue' – see figure 7.

For each school selected you will be asked to provide the following information:

1. Sibling information – you should click on the relevant box and fill in the details if your child has a brother or sister already at the school.
2. Exceptional medical or social reasons – you should tick the relevant box if there are medical or social reasons for your child to attend a particular school. You will be required to provide documentary evidence to support this.
3. Additional reasons – this is for you to give additional reasons for wanting a particular school.

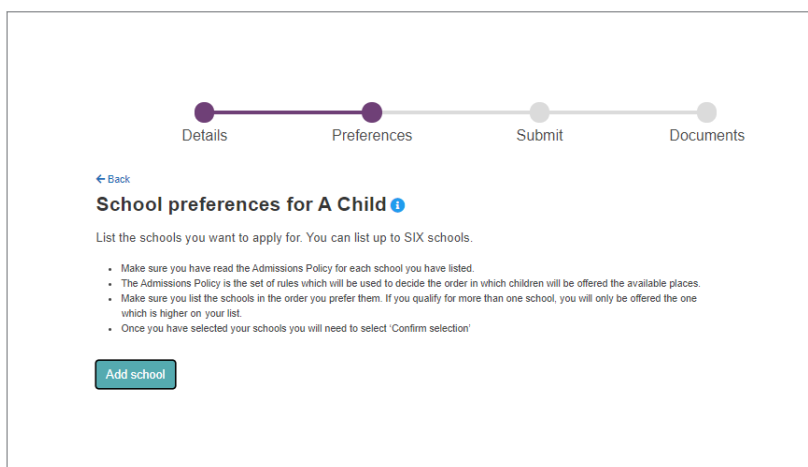

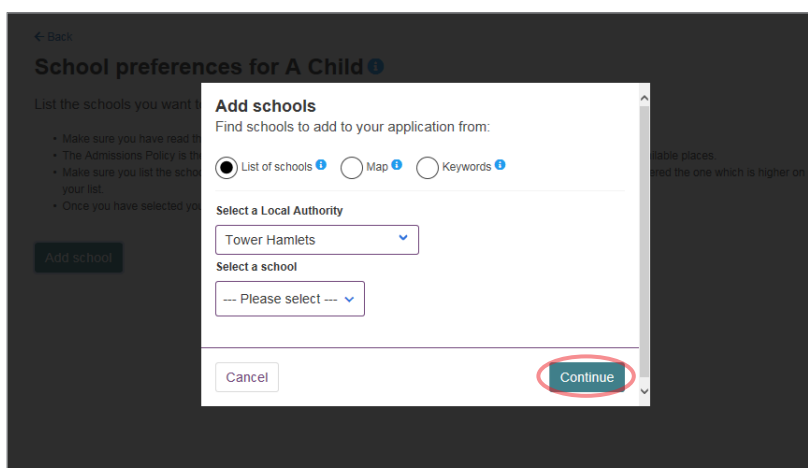

When you have entered all the required information, you will be prompted to check that the information is accurate and then asked to submit application – see figure 8.

Even if you submit it straight away, you can still make changes later, right up until the closing date.
